
Dear Stitchers,

Well, another year has come and gone - I hope you all had an enjoyable festive season - we certainly did! At the moment all I hear is cricket, cricket, cricket, so it was "earplugs in, new designs out"!

- First up is "All my Love", the Love Bouquet suitable for both Valentine's Day and also for family members or friends who are in need of a little bit of extra attention. For a smaller notelet card, stitch just the top 3 flowers and two tendrils makes it even quicker. Layer it on a red or green backing for greater impact! Just a note for stitchers the instructions for the stems and tendrils says Back Stitch but I often find that a simple running stitch up a stem, turn around and come back, is also easy. *Pricking 15 minutes, Stitching approx. 2 hours.*
- The "Christening Font" was a special request which I hope others will also enjoy this is a Quick and Easy Design. I chose to work it in Gold on White but you might like to do it in Silver on a darker colour. The Window alone would make a simple smaller card look at your other patterns and see if you can take "bits" to use in this way.
 - Pricking 10 minutes, Stitching approx.1¼ hours.
- "Easter Teddy", in his brightly coloured eggshell, wishes your family a Happy Easter and Happy Egg Hunting.

Pricking - 30 minutes, Stitching - approx. 2 hours.



Using the 'Glitz' threads can be somewhat of a challenge so here are a couple of tips:

Threading:

Easiest is the needle threader pictured (right, top), This is usually included in the Household pack of needles available from haberdashers.


Failing that, the masking tape method also works well (below right). Fold the small piece of tape around the thread, making sure the thread lies tight against the fold. Trim to a tiny arrowhead as shown.

Stitching:

Use lengths of no more than 30 to 35 cms at a time then you are less likely to develop breaks or shredding.

Straighten out the thread from time to time as the filaments sometimes slide loose from the lurex and you want to keep them even so as not to develop loops and bobbles.
